
Congratulations again to all of our winners! I hope to see all of you at a Society of Air Force Pharmacy Conference in 2022!

## Keeping the "All Thrust, No Vector?" Mantra Alive and Well



It is a tremendous honor to be serving as your SAFP Treasurer as a former Air Force prior-enlisted, officer, now PHS officer attached and detailed to the FDA and soon to be retiree this fall.

Let me provide some rationale for this subject matter – all thrust, no vector. I was particularly intrigued with one of my first Air Force Pharmacy mentors, LTC Zastawny, utilizing the expression, "All thrust, no vector?" I have found this to be an invaluable guiding principle in my career. It is not confusing being "busy" with achieving results but aligning these two pieces to optimize outcomes (working smarter, not harder if you will). I've narrowed this article into three major concepts (teamwork, attitude and achieving excellence).

- *Teamwork* is synergistic collective wisdom and certainly "no one is as smart as all of us."
- Accountability is a hallmark of teamwork (which may mean admitting you are wrong but leads to earned not demanded trust and respect). It also means doing what you say you are going to do which fosters mutual team trust.
- Resiliency in the spirit of the advent of hurricane season, and an analogy that has stuck with me from my days at CG AIRSTA Miami when my CO compared this concept to a palm tree. This may sound a little silly, but he had a great point. A palm tree can dance in the face of disaster due to being pliable while having a deep root system. As a team, we can better cope with adversity, adapt to change and overcome challenges. So, don't be overwhelmed by your circumstances, but know there are resources and people available to help you through and don't ever give up!!!
- Be part of the solution not the problem, much like a backseat driver. As a leader, to help your team work more effectively, do not unnecessarily obligate other's time, be sure to draw in all members for their input, set the tone, manage expectations, communicate effectively and empower them with the resources they need to accomplish the mission.

**<u>Attitude</u>** – It's a choice! 
